- An estimate of potential (a mix of forecast and plan)
- Recommendations for investment
- Essential for astronomy, but for social science?

- Our motivation
 - Go big
 - Gain standing for social & behavioral science
 - Embrace external/open resources
 - Align to today's threats

Initial disconnects

Social science academics don't forecast their own work

- Academic leaders are not keyed to practice
 - Peripheral players fill the gap
- Practitioners are interested but constrained

- 'Translation' is key
 - Government involvement makes the difference
